



PRODUCTION SPORTS CAR RACING ASSOC. OF QUEENSLAND (INC)

2021 Championship Series Regulations

These supplementary regulations form the basis upon which the 2021 Series will be administered. Further regulations may be issued as required during the 2021 series.

1 ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the Series each competitor must be a current financial member of Prod Sports QLD (PSCRAQ), be driving an eligible car (see section 4) and while competing have at least one forward facing video camera in operation.

Competitors by nature of entering the Series must also abide by Club documents that are applicable while competing.

2 2021 EVENTS

2.1 Non championship events

Motorsport Australia (MA) have a total of 4 MA Championship rounds planned for the year, all held at Morgan Park and run by different clubs.

Round 5 & Round 7 listed above will earn members points for the club's championship. Members are eligible to enter the following events should they wish, which will give them points towards the MA Championship.

- Morgan Park, Friday 26th to Sunday 28th March - MGCCQ
- Morgan Park, Friday 4th to Sunday 6th June - CORD



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3 ROUND FORMATS

The series will consist of 3 x two day rounds and 4 x one day rounds, 3 at Morgan Park, 1 at Lakeside Park and 3 at Queensland Raceway.

- All race starts will be by Rolling Starts.
- The one day rounds will nominally consist of 1 x 15 minute qualifying session followed by 3 or 4 sprint races.
- One of the two day rounds will consist of 1 x 15 minute qualifying session followed by 3 races. One sprint race and two 30 minute Mini Enduro races.
- The other two day rounds will consist of 1 x 15 minute qualifying session followed by 4 sprint races.
- A "Progressive Grid" will be used for all events.

4 ELIGIBLE CARS

As a condition of entry to the Series, competitors understand that their car, as presented for competition, will comply to either Motorsport Australia category 2B class 1, 2 or 3, or 2F regardless of the promoter of the event and regardless of whether the car has a Motorsport Australia Log Book or not. Should a competing car not comply in any area, Competitors shall bring this to the attention of a committee member for adjudication. The committee may accept entries from other cars on a race-by-race basis however entry for non-compliant cars must not be assumed.

5 CAMERAS

While competing competitors must have at least one forward facing video camera with a field of view sufficient to show the road ahead and at least both A-pillars, or the extremities of the front guards (see Figure 1 and Figure 2 for examples). The Camera shall be turned on, functioning, and recording at all times during qualifying and racing. The club reserves the right to ask a competitor to move a camera should it not meet the above requirements or intent of the rule.

At the request of the DSO, the recordings must be made available to the DSO or a PSCRAQ committee member in a timely manner. Not producing a viewable recording will not stop the investigation and may result in a penalty additional to any penalty for the incident.

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6 CLASSES

The series will operate with 2 classes based on Motorsport Australia (previously CAMS) Group 2B and 2F regulations. There will be a 3rd class, 2X for invited category 2 cars that do not comply with either 2B or 2F above. Please note class 2X is by invitation only.

7 WET TRACK

In the event that rain falls prior to or during a race meeting, all races will be run and will count towards the point score. Cancellation will only take place due to instruction from race control.

8 POINT SYSTEM

All 3 classes will be awarded the same points based on finishing position, as outlined in Table 1.

One point will be awarded, per Class, for Pole Position as determined by qualifying.

One point will be awarded, per Class, for the fastest lap achieved during each race of the Series in 2021.

To receive points Competitors must NOT be classed as a DNF (Did Not Finish) or a DNS (Did Not Start) on the official race result timesheets.



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9 TROPHIES AND AWARDS

Awards which recognise the achievement of competitors will be presented to the first three [3] place getters in each class in each round of the series. **In the event of a tie (equal points), the position will be awarded to the competitor who finishes the last race of the event in the higher position.**

Class Championship Trophies will be awarded to the first three [3] place getters in each class according to the Series point score at the conclusion of the 2021 series.

One overall Prod Sports QLD Champion will be crowned in 2021. The winner can come from any of the three Classes and will be determined by whoever accumulates the most points, in their class, during 2021.

Note: - The 2021 Series, Class and Overall championships will be determined from each competitor's accumulated points from their 6 best rounds of the 7 rounds in 2021 i.e. each competitor can drop one round and will not be disadvantaged.

10 ENTRY FEE

Entry fees for Queensland Raceway and Lakeside will be \$350 per race meeting.

- Entry is via the QR website, payment by credit card is required when entering.
- If you withdraw from the race meeting before qualifying a credit voucher can be arranged to be used for future race meeting entry.

Entry fees for all events will be dependent on what can be negotiated with Race Meeting Promoters.

- Entry for Motorsport Australia events at Morgan Park can be entered by the MA Member portal.
- As Prod Sports do not buy grid spots at Morgan Park, refunds for withdrawing will have to be negotiated between Competitors and the Race Meeting Promoter.
- Enter for Australian Motor Race Series (AMRS) at Morgan Park – TBA

11 RESULTS

Results will be calculated at each race meeting and trophies awarded at the completion of competition.

Round results will be posted on the website and Facebook as soon as practicable following each round.
